Director's Address – Dr. K. R. Muthuswamy

Key Points Discussed

Disciplinary Guidelines

- A minimum of 75% attendance is mandatory for eligibility to appear in the first semester examinations.
- Parents were advised to regulate their wards' mobile phone usage at home.
- Students coming late by skipping breakfast will be marked absent for the first hour.
- Leave during CAT examinations is **strictly not permitted**. Any unavoidable leave must be informed to the class in-charge in advance.

Academic Guidelines

- Parents should encourage their wards to complete records and assignments at home regularly.
- Mobile phone use should be restricted, except for specific purposes such as **Naan** Mudhalvan classes, scholarship work, and UMIS data updates.
- Students must submit all **UMIS-related documents** on time.
- Parents were requested to **clear any pending fees within two weeks**.

Parent Feedback & Responses

Some parents requested that 1 college buses wait a few more minutes at certain stops.

The Principal explained the importance of adhering to the bus schedule to maintain college timings. Parents were advised to ensure that their wards reach the bus stop at least 5 minutes early.

Parents expressed that teachers were not assigning homework, 2 leading to increased mobile use at home.

The Principal clarified that homework is regularly posted in class WhatsApp groups. Parents were encouraged to check the group daily and monitor their wards' usage.
